



CORAL REEF MOSAIC

A mosaic is defined as a picture or pattern made by inlaying small colored pieces of glass, stone or other material.

This installation is the most detailed undersea glass mosaic of its size ever assembled making it the largest of its kind in the world.

The mosaic image is composed of many photographs taken at different scuba diving reefs throughout the Cayman Islands. The photographs have been assembled to create a representation of the ideal diving reef experience.

There are in excess of 3,000,000 tiles comprising the mosaic image.

There are 180 varieties of coloured glass in the mosaic.

The broken white circle at the top of the mosaic represents the SUN shining through the ocean's surface.

All of the sea life shown in the mosaic are actual examples found in the reefs surrounding the three Cayman Islands (Grand Cayman, Little Cayman and Cayman Brac).

It took one year to hand-cut and assemble all of the glass tiles. It took eight months to install the entire mosaic as it appears today.
